EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI) REF. UNDPSO- EOI-2016-002 PREQUALIFICATION FOR PROVISION OF UNARMED SECURITY SERVICES IN SOMALILAND

I. Background

The United Nations Development Programme in Somalia (UNDP) invites qualified professional security companies to submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) to provide unarmed security guard services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at the United Nations Common Compound (UNCC) in Hargeisa, Somaliland which serves as the Area Office for UNDP and other UN agencies. The UNCC comprises five blocks and open spaces covering a total of 13,849 sqm enclosed in a perimeter wall. Security is also extended to the nearby UN dispensary in Hargeisa. At any one time, there are approximately 70 staff members in the compound.

The overall objective is to provide a visible deterrent to potential attackers and an unarmed response to repel any attack on the UNCC. The successful Applicant(s) will be responsible for enforcing UN rules and regulations governing the access to UN compounds and facilities under UNDPs control. The Applicant(s) should have knowledge of safety and security issues including experience in operation of firefighting equipment, assessment of potential threats and crime prevention, operation of communication equipment, access control, guarding compounds, patrol, handling incoming suspicious parcels and crowd management. In addition to the below requirements, the preferred service provider should also show potential for future expansion of services to other United Nations (UN) facilities across all locations in Somaliland where UNDP has management responsibility of UN premises.

This EOI will form the basis of a shortlist of potential service providers that will be considered prequalified and therefore invited to submit offers at a later stage.

II. Eligibility Criteria

Interested companies are encouraged to apply if they meet the eligibility criteria below and, are required to submit supporting documentation (where applicable) in line with the eligibility criteria outlined **below.** EOI from applicants failing to provide the complete information to fulfill the basic eligibility criteria will be considered non-responsive.

Eligibility of Applicants that are wholly or partly owned by the Government shall be subject to UNDPs further evaluation and review of various factors such as being registered as an independent entity, the extent of Government ownership/share, receipt of subsidies, mandate, access to information in relation to this EOI, and others that may lead to undue advantage against other Applicants, and the eventual rejection of the Application.

If the Applicant is a group of legal entities that will form or have formed a joint venture, consortium or association at the time of the submission of the EOI, they shall confirm in their EOI that they have designated one party to act as a lead entity, duly vested with authority to legally bind the members of the joint venture jointly and severally, and this shall be duly evidenced by a duly notarized Agreement among the legal entities. All individual entities that comprise the joint venture shall be subject to the eligibility and qualification assessment by UNDP, therefore, eligibility documents relating to each entity must be submitted with the EOI.

III. SUBMISSION DETAILS

The EOI and accompanying documents must be received on or before **17:00H Kenya local time (GMT+3) on August 19, 2016** indicating the advertisement responded to in accordance with the instructions provided below. EOI received after the deadline indicated above for whatever reason will not be considered.

- Maximum file size per transmission is <u>5MB per transmission</u>, which must be free from any form of virus or corrupted contents. There is no restriction on the number of files sent but each transmission must be labelled, for example, 1 of 3, 2 of 3, 3 of 3, etc.
- Zipped files should not be used
- Signature: The EOI cover letter must be signed and stamped
- EOIs submitted to personal UNDP email addresses will not be considered.

Expression of Interest (EOI) from service providers failing to provide the required information will be disregarded. After this prequalification round, the next stages of the process will be conducted in accordance with the procedures set out in the UNDP Programme and Procurement Guidelines and UNDP Financial Rules and Regulations.
